#### 30/20 Declaration of Interests

<u>Minute Number 35/20 (ii), Housing Needs Survey</u> – Councillor Richard Bland declared an interest because he had a family connection to Newbottle Estate.

<u>Minute Number 35/20 (ii), Housing Needs Survey</u> – Councillor Adrian Kelly declared an interest because a possible proposed site for an affordable housing, was to the rear of his property.

#### 35/20 Village Matters

i) Playing Field and Pavilion – There was no update on the pavilion project.

ii) Housing Needs Survey – The Parish Council had received the results of the Housing Needs Survey and prior to the meeting, Councillor Adrian Kelly had circulated some suggested issues to be raised with Midland Rural Housing.

**<u>Resolved</u>** that the report that:

- 1) the report be noted;
- 2) the following questions be submitted to Midland Rural Housing:
  - Did the survey ask how many people in the village who currently live in affordable homes plan to move out in the next 5 years?
  - Where do the people who will need an affordable home the next 5 years currently live?
  - How many of those who said that they need an affordable home in the next 5 years currently live in properties rented from the Newbottle Estate or the family?

## These minutes have been agreed by the Chairman and are now subject to approval at the Parish Council meeting on 16 November 2020

- You cannot deduce from the survey results that 11 affordable homes are needed in the village in the next 5 years. That would be a net 11 homes, but those people may be able to buy/rent existing affordable homes which become available in the meantime.
- If 11 affordable homes were to be built where would the children living in these home go to school? The village school is considerably over-subscribed.
- iii) Speed Signs Councillor Adrian Kelly advised that the poles had been removed and although the County Council had been contacted, they had not yet put them back in place. The pole which the VAS was installed on, had been hit and damaged and the sign was not now facing the correct direction.

<u>Resolved</u> that the report be noted and the County Council be requested to complete the repair to the pole. Action TG

 iv) Green Lane Allotments – The Parish Council discussed the four parcels of allotment land on Green Lane. There had been a number of queries with regard to this land, but it was unclear who the four land owners were.
